In 2013, assisted voluntary return and reintegration (AVRR) programmes globally required the direct involvement of 70 International Organization for Migration (IOM) offices in host countries and 166 countries of origin to assist 46,233 migrants to voluntarily return and reintegrate.

Chart I: Overview of AVRR assisted migrants, CoO and CoD between 2012 and 2013




Chart 2 shows the numbers of AVRR Beneficiaries globally over a 12 year period, from 2001 to 2013.

Since 2011, there has been a progressive increase in AVRR activities. In comparison with 2012, the number of AVRR assisted migrants increased by 10% in 2013. In total, there were 140 AVRR.

As it can be seen in Chart 3, while the majority of AVRR took place from the EU Member States, Norway and Switzerland, voluntary returns from transit regions and the Americas were increasing.

Forty percent (40%) of the assisted migrants returned to South-Eastern Europe, Eastern Europe or Central Asia (Chart 4). This region thus remained the prevailing origin region for AVRR in 2013, with AVRR activities increasing by 4% in comparison with 2012. The second most represented region, Asia and the Pacific, also showed a significant percentage of assisted voluntary returns (30%).

As illustrated in Chart 5, 71% of the AVRR beneficiaries in 2013 were male and 29% female. In comparison with 2012, the number of assisted female migrants increased by 6%. This may partly be due to the increasing number of gender oriented projects.





Chart 5: Overview of female/male returnees for AVRR worldwide in 2013


As illustrated in Chart 6, the AVRR beneficiaries in 2013 were mostly adults (78%). In comparison with 2012, the number of assisted minors doubled while the number of assisted adults decreased by 11%.

Among the adults, the most represented group concerns 18-29 year-old migrants, the latter accounting for 34% of the totality of migrants assisted. The second biggest group concerns 30-39 year-old migrants or 25% of migrants assisted (Chart 7).

As shown in Chart 8, the major host countries for returnees were Germany, Greece, Belgium, Netherlands and Austria, as in year 2012, while among the TOP 10 countries, instead of Somalia and Mexico, one discovers Poland and Italy. In 2013, Somalia did not have any AVRR activities, while Mexico had 17 persons only. This is mainly due to shifting donor priorities.





Chart 8:TOP 10 Host Countries for AVRR in 2013

As shown in Chart 9, while the number of the beneficiaries from Germany and Greece increased for 32% and 29% respectively, Belgium, Netherlands and Austria assisted less migrants than in 2012 (resp. 6%, 12% and 11%).



As shown in Chart 10, the major countries of origin of returnees were Pakistan, the Russian Federation, Serbia, the FYR of Macedonia and Bangladesh. The list of TOP 10 countries of origin did not change in comparison with 2012 except for Iran which replaced Ethiopia. Among the 10 countries, however, there were more assisted returns to Bangladesh and less to Iraq and Afghanistan.

In comparison with 2012 (as shown in Chart 11), the number of returnees to the Russian Federation, Bangladesh, Pakistan and Kosovo increased by 94%, 66%, 30% and 16% respectively. The number of returnees to Serbia stayed the same while returnees to Iraq, Brazil, Afghanistan and Ethiopia were fewer than in 2012.

Out of 5,606 returnees to Pakistan, 4,976 arrived from Greece only, followed by Turkey and the EEU countries. Case of Bangladesh is similar, with 1,443 returnees from Greece (total of 2'000), then Indonesia and the EEU countries. When it comes to Afghanistan, 711 returnees arrived from Greece, 249 from Turkey and the rest from the EEU mostly Scandinavian countries (total 1,624 returnees).

The following two charts show the major countries of transit, without EEU (Chart 14) and the major countries of origin of returnees from transit countries (Chart 15).

Chart 12:TOP 10 Countries of Transit in 2013 (excluding EEU)




Chart 13:TOP 10 Countries of Origin for AVRR from transit countries




Chart 15 provides a comprehensive overview of the type of assistance provided to returnees towards their reintegration in their countries of origin, that is, during the first three to twelve months after return has taken place. Converted in percentages, the 140 AVRR projects carried out in 2013 included grants, vocational training, business set-up and job placement activities.




Chart 15: Reintegration assistance provided under AVRR Programmes in 2013

Besides these, the reintegration assistance can also include: counseling (referral to legal counseling and guidance, family tracing) or payment of education fees for children.

In 2013, the business set-up component stayed equally represented as in year 2012, integrating 15 AVRR projects approximately. When it comes to the monitoring and evaluation components, there were 61 projects including this component in 2013 (and only 23 in 2012).

This illustrates a growing need to follow the reintegration process more closely, through monitoring and evaluation procedures.

#### **AVRR** projects in Focus

In 2013, IOM carried out 75 projects global projects. These are managed by an IOM mission in a specific host country and respond to the wish of migrants from different countries of origin to voluntary return. 7 projects operated regionally, either through a joint project carried out by IOM missions in several host or transit countries offering AVRR to a specific country, thus joining forces to better respond to root causes of irregular migration in a specific country (for example AVRR from West Africa to Sri Lanka) or projects carried out by one mission in one host country offering AVRR to several countries that share common challenges (for example AVRR from Thailand to Bali Process Member States). In addition, there were 5 country projects, i. e. AVRR from a specific host country to a specific country of origin. These projects respond to both the needs of migrants in the host country, as well as to the reintegration needs detected in the country of origin (for example AVRR from Switzerland to Nigeria).

In response to the continuous changing reintegration patterns, AVRR programmes have naturally diversified to respond to these challenges. One new project area is AVRR projects focusing on children (especially unaccompanied migrant children) with targeted activities geared towards their reintegration in their country of origin. Also, projects have been developed to respond to the specific needs of vulnerable groups. Specific and tailored reintegration packages have been designed for families with children, migrants with health related needs, victims of trafficking and other vulnerable groups of returnees.

While traditionally, AVRR projects were developed in the destination countries, there is a growing interest in addressing explicit concerns in countries of origin, often detected through research (such as the MAGNET project described below). By including the country of origin perspective in an AVRR programme - through cooperation with the authorities in the country of origin and targeted reintegration measures - the sustainability of return can be enhanced for all parties, i. d. the migrants, and host and origin countries.

The successful implementation of these programmes demands coordination and partnerships between the participating countries and the local actors on the ground that may enhance reintegration perspectives, such as ministries, development agencies, the private sector and civil society.

Joint programmes can also address specific issues such as gender and women empowerment issues. During the year 2013, such projects were mostly implemented in South and Central America (Argentina, Paraguay, Uruguay and Nicaragua) as well as in Azerbaijan, targeting the promotion of human rights from a gender perspective. Activities included campaigns on human rights, building protection services and mechanisms of prevention and reintegration.

In addition, projects have been created to enhance dialogue among host countries, transit countries and countries of origin to learn from each other, exchange good practices and lessons learned, for example through platforms and study visits.



In 2010, IOM Iraq commissioned Altai Consulting to conduct an external research study, in order to enable a better understanding over the "scalability" of IOM's returnee reintegration programmes and to identify potential partners in Iraq to help with the reintegration of Iraqi returnees. As a result the MAGNET project was developed. It contributes to the establishment of a common approach for the reintegration of rejected asylum seekers – and irregular migrants when applicable – returning to Iraq (Kurdistan Regional of Iraq, KR-I) from a number of EUMS, through the implementation of a set of integrated activities in the field of pre-departure support and post-arrival reintegration in order to facilitate the reintegration process. The project contributes to increase the interest in assisted voluntary return to Iraq (KR-I) by reinforcing the job placement mechanisms already implemented in most Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) programmes in Iraq (KR-I).



The EC acknowledged that a lot of different stakeholders are active in the field of voluntary return, including national, regional, local authorities, international organizations, civil society among others and that it has a strong external component involving the same range of stakeholders in countries of return.

In response to this, under the 2010 Community Actions IOM implemented the VREN project which was a two year project with 16 other EU MS to set up a European network on voluntary return including the 27 EU Member States, Norway and Switzerland, as well as major countries of transit and origin involved in voluntary return and reintegration related activities.

Such an initiative by IOM clearly highlighted its intention to address the call of the EC to further foster and facilitate communication, cooperation and information exchange between Member States and countries of transit and origin, highlighting the link of pre-departure and reintegration assistance as well as proposing sustainable and comprehensive AVRR programmes that will remain the basis of the voluntary return approach of the authorities in EU MS.
